### **Preparing for Hostile Behavior** By Hazel Siff



#### How to Repair a Toxic Board

A new report on boards suggests their culture needs a rethink. Key to that is assessing where disagreements are and creating opportunities to debate. By Mark Athitakis

Association boards are paradoxical creatures. They exist to create a consensus around an organization's priorities, but they are also meant to foster robust debate around challenging issues. Drift too far toward consensus, and you risk a rubber-stamp board. Drift in the other direction, and you risk open conflict. So it's unsurprising that, <u>according to a 2022 PricewaterhouseCoopers survey of corporate boards</u>, nearly half of all board members would like to replace at least one of their colleagues.
